HOUSE CORP WINTER 2025 UPDATE



January 2025 – Much "business as usual" so far as property management is concerned, so I won't bore you with those details. The chapter has continued to demonstrate a very positive approach toward keeping the chapter house well taken care of.

A good example is Home-

coming 2024, when a well-decorated Halloween party took place Friday night with a clean up that left the property spotless for the annual meeting and Homecoming, which was very well-attended with over 70 alumni coming back. The chapter gets mega snaps for a great effort at Homecoming weekend. More on that elsewhere in this edition.

On the subject of the SU Ostrom dormitory project, the ad hoc Comstock Greek Alliance made considerable progress with the university, getting the project to be scaled back to exclude the proposed "T" extension of the building from Ostrom through to Comstock with a massive structure to the north of our chapter house. A driver to the plan revision was the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board (SLPB) action to designate 721 Comstock as a property worthy of preservation as a historical landmark.

The university will now have to preserve 721 Comstock in an "as is" state or renovate it up to its historical standard. There is an active initiative to designate the entirety of Comstock as an historical landmark. Such an action would not be in our best interest financially as it would effectively "down zone" the property from its Planned Institutional District status to one with oversight of the SLPB, as they would have the right to approve or deny demolition of the property. While we have



no desire to knock down 737 Comstock and have every intent of preserving the property for future generations of Psi Psi brothers, having a highest and best use for a private housing project with over 200 beds allows for underwriting a redevelopment value of the land in excess of \$3.6 million. Such a valuation affords a prospective lender the ability to present a comfortable loan to value ratio in line with the other property valuation methods. There are others in the Comstock Greek Alliance who share our point of view that the Landmark Designation is not in their best interest.

A building permit application was filed in August of 2024 in an effort to give us a freeze on zoning in the event the Landmark Designation was imposed on the Comstock block. The application is slowly grinding its way through the City of Syracuse bureaucracy, no doubt in part due to the desire to support the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board. I will continue to keep the pressure on, ideally without having to involve attorneys.

Charles E. Summerall entered Chapter Eternal on January 27, 2025, after a long bout with Alzheimer's. Known to his friends as Charlie, he was born on September 10, 1947. After graduating from Ankara High School in Ankara, Turkey, Charlie went on to attend SU. He was initiated into the Psi Psi Chapter on May 5, 1968. Graduating from SU in 1969 with a Bachelor of Science degree, Charlie went on to the Maxwell School, graduating in 1970 with a master's degree in international affairs.

Charlie's big brother was none other than Bill Beach, with whom he worked in the summer of 1968, along with many other brothers, to undertake restoration work on the newly purchased 737 Comstock Avenue chapter house. Charlie was fond of telling the story about brothers using heat guns to strip down the varnish off woodwork throughout the first floor. At one point, there was a small fire behind the woodwork, which was fortunately quickly extinguished.

Charlie attained the rank of first lieutenant in the Army. After being honorably discharged in 1973, Charlie and Sally (Suominen) married. They met at Syracuse through the Sigma Chi Little Sister program. Charlie attended George Washington University, earning a master's degree in Russian studies and international affairs, and went on to work as a U.S. government civil servant for Naval Intelligence and the CIA, earning many accolades for his research and writings. He retired in 2019.
